

DRESS POLICY – 2020/2021

Dance attire is an important part of learning to dance. A dress code lends a feeling of uniformity to the class. Baggy clothing and long pants make it impossible for the teacher to see your posture, movements and footwork. If you begin by looking like a dancer, you will feel more like one! Please be willing to contribute to class spirit by abiding by our studio policy. **HAIR MUST BE OFF THE FACE, TIED BACK IN A PONYTAIL OR A BUN. PROPER DANCE ATTIRE MUST BE WORN.**

A NOTE ON 'TIGHTS'. All classes, including ballet, wear tan tights. This makes it easier for dancers who are in multiple classes. Proper dance tights are required and are available at Fantasy Costumes in Red Deer. **Absolutely no nylons!**

KINDER/PRIMARY LEVELS

- **BALLET:** Pink Slippers, Tan Tights, Choice of Colors for Bodysuit, Bootie shorts or Ballet Skirt. Skirts must be no longer than the knee.
- **TAP:** Black tap shoes w/elastic, not laces.
- **HIP HOP:** Loose fitting clothing (sweatpants), inside sneakers.

JUNIOR LEVEL + OLDER

- **BALLET:** Pink Slippers, Tan Tights, Black Tank Bodysuit, Black Skirt (not past knees) Bootie shorts or capris - no long pants.
- **LYRICAL & CONTEMPORARY:** Capri tan tights and foot undies
- **POINTE:** Ballet attire (tights must be full-length w/whole in bottom), Pointe Shoes, as fitted by the professionals at the Dancewear Store
- **TAP:** Black lace-up or slip-on tap shoes, tan tights, black tank bodysuit, black bootie shorts
- **JAZZ:** Black lace-up or slip-on jazz slippers, Tan tights, Black tank bodysuit, Black bootie shorts.
- **HIP HOP:** Loose fitting clothing (sweatpants), inside sneakers. (Bodysuit and tights w/shorts or sweatpants over is also fine!) Teacher will shop for matching sneakers for the class, once class is established; to be reimbursed by the parent.
- **BOYS:** Black Shorts or Capri Pants and Black (form-fitting) top for jazz, tap, musical theatre. Sweats may be worn for Hip Hop.
